Position Purpose:

The primary role of the EGOI Deputy Team Leader is to support the EGOI Team Leader to lead the coordination of the Australian EGOI team by providing support, guidance and training to young women interested and skilled in informatics.

The role will involve engagement in high performance activities including training schools, team selection and competition events (domestic and international).

Position Responsibilities

Under direction and supervision of the Director of Training - Informatics:

- 1. Accompany, supervise, monitor and coordinate the EGOI team and staff, including attendance at:
 - a. Selection Schools and Schools of Excellence
 - b. EGOI Team announcement (domestic)
 - c. EGOI competition (international or virtual, if required)
- 2. In conjunction with the Director of Training Informatics, assist in the identification and selection of students for the Selection School and School of Excellence through participation on selection committees and review of competition results
- 3. Advise the Selection Committee and Director of Training Informatics in the determination of the EGOI Team
- 4. Assist the Director of Training Informatics in the identification of staff for high performance activities

- 5. Coordinate the EGOI team training, including delivering lecturing and mentoring activities
- 6. Provide a report on the EGOI competition
- 7. Other tasks as reasonably directed by the EGOI Team Leader, Director of Training Informatics or Director Performance and Pathways.

Selection Criteria:

Required Skills

- Demonstrated passion and enthusiasm for increasing opportunities in informatics for young women in Australia
- Ability in informatics suitable to the development of a high-performance program and development of a high performing team
- Experience in informatics training and/or teaching, preferably at the secondary, tertiary or Olympiad levels
- Experience leading or teaching groups of young people and possess an understanding of key duty of care issues relating to the management of young people
- Strong communication skills, including written and verbal communication
- Excellent organisational and management skills
- Current Working with Vulnerable People Check or ability to attain
- Current Senior First Aid certification or ability to attain

Preferred

- A tertiary qualification in informatics
- Experience in a national High Performance (Olympiad) program
